

“Over the past decade or so, there has been an attendant rise in interest in what you might call traditional photography culture. Although British art institutions were embarrassingly late in acknowledging the importance of photography curation – Tate appointed their first photography curator in 2009, almost 70 years after the Museum of Modern Art in New York did so – galleries are now finally according the medium the space it deserves as an art form. The new photography wing of the Victoria and Albert museum has just opened and, next spring, the Swedish organisation Fotografiska will open an 8,300 sq metre (89,000 sq ft) space in Whitechapel and another vast gallery in New York, both dedicated to contemporary photography.”

One of the things about the print-on-demand books is that I thought of the book as a whole as a work of art, not the individual pictures. I was taking pictures with the book in mind, and thinking about how they relate to each other. And I found that that took a certain pressure off the individual picture, and that the individual picture could be more of one note that would be part of the chord, or the phrase, which would be the book.

I found that same quality again years later when I encountered Instagram. A new means of distribution and a new means of communication open possibilities that didn't exist before.

I also found in Instagram the kind of playfulness that I liked in the books—that I could try an idea for a day and explore it. But also, in Instagram, I'm fascinated by the visual communities that develop. I find it very satisfying that they're a group of people who look at each other's work every day, and they're all over the world. And when I do meet people that I look at regularly on Instagram, I have a feeling that we're friends, that I know them well.

19 – RAW Vs. JPG

One of the defining differences between low and high end digital cameras is the ability to shoot **raw** files instead of the usual **jpg**. To really understand what the difference between the two types of file is, we need to go back to the [components of a camera](#). As you may remember from that lesson, a digital sensor is only a grid of photo sensitive receptors, and the result of an exposure is just a big bunch of numbers corresponding to the light level recorded at each pixel. This does not make a visible image yet, as a number of steps are still required before it can be viewed. In particular, obtaining colour information for each pixel needs a process called **demosaicing**, but you also need to apply [white balance](#), a contrast curve, sharpening, saturation and possibly some other treatments, for instance [noise reduction](#).



There are two ways to perform this. You can either let your camera do it for you, with minimal input, resulting in a file ready to be viewed, usually in the standard jpg format. Alternatively, you can tell the camera to do as little as possible and perform each step yourself at a later point, with dedicated software.







Light not lights — look at what the light shines on rather than where it comes from — so, for example, if you think of a lovely sunset, don't point your camera at the sun. Instead, turn with your back to the sun and photograph things bathed in its deep red colours. If it's a strong light, then pay attention to the shadows. If it's a soft and diffused light, then notice how certain colours are more vibrant.

Black and White Soft Light — Find a light source that casts a gentle light over your image, if you're struggling to identify a soft light, it's the sort of light that you can look at without blinking and doesn't make solid shadows. For this task, switch your camera/app to black and white.

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Week 8 - Perspective



Hello hello good morning!

How are you? Heads still spinning around with sinuous windy roads? We really really liked your perspectives on serpentine yesterday! Well done!

We think that by now, we are ready for the next steps. Now that you have mastered the basic tricks of perspective, let's go on and use them to draw something real! How about drawing a room for example? Maybe the room you are drawing in, or some room you would like to call your own? Will you invite us in?

Do you have fun with different perspectives? If not, you could [play a bit](#) to warm up:-)



But why should we draw rooms? In a room there are so many geometric shapes to be found and they all call out to be put into perspective! Isn't it a very cool thing to transform geometric shapes into real life objects? We did this already when we were learning how to use axonometry, remember how we brought real objects to life then? We promise now it will be even nicer - perspective will do the magic! It will give depth to the objects found in our rooms.. :-)

Ready to open the door and enter our very own chamber of secrets?

Let's turn the key and open the door!

Once again we start by drawing the horizon (yes, our room definitely has a horizon!). Draw a horizontal line a little above the middle of your sheet. Now define the central vanishing point that will be used to draw the main lines framing your room. Draw 4 very light lines that start from the central vanishing point and go towards 4 different directions: top-left, top-right, bottom-left and bottom-right. Starting from these lines we will draw the ceiling and the floor of our room.


By now your room is ready to be furnished. What is in there to be found? A cozy sofa, a fancy bed, a nice desk? Or are we in a completely different room?

Position all kinds of objects in the room, maybe there are also windows, the door through which we entered... All objects that are parallel to the horizon line should use the central vanishing point.

Maybe, your objects are rotated - like the table and chair in Fabio's drawing? If you want to draw that kind of object, you will need to use 2 different vanishing points. Position them on the horizon far apart from each other.

After all this information you probably feel like dancing...
Best to do that before or after drawing:-)
